Your audition will be like taking a technique class at the studio. It will consist of a warmup, center technique, across the floor technique, flexibility exercises and a combo (jazz or contemporary). During the class, beginning or end, you will also learn a short tap combo. If you are new to tap and don't have shoes, please bring sneakers.

We recommend wearing form-fitted bright dance wear with your hair pulled back.

Remember that as a part of your team requirements, your dancer will be required to attend technique classes, choreography rehearsals and/or master classes in August. 1. You are committed to our Bobbie's team

9. You understand consequences

Not fulfilling your commitment through the end of the season has a huge ripple effect and will not be tolerated lightly. If you are unable to fulfill your commitment to our Bobbie's Company from August 1, 2022 - July 1st, 2023 there will be the following consequences: You will be required to pay for new replacement costumes for any team member filling into your spots. There will be a flat \$500 re-staging fee and no refunds or credits will be given to you or placed in your account. All credits in your account will be void. All outstanding fees will need to be paid within 2 weeks of your departure. No exceptions.
